Kiwanis-Bennett Memorial Scholarship

The Kiwanis-Bennett Memorial Scholarship committee has just completed the selection of scholarship recipients for the 2016/2017 school year. As always, we had a wonderful selection of students to choose from. With so many great applicants, the most difficult part of the process is not determining who gets a scholarship; it's determining who does not get a scholarship. Each committee member independently reviews every application. We then get together for what we call the 'Knock out' round, where we determine which students we would like to bring in for an interview.

On May 18, we spent the day interviewing these candidates (only 10 minutes per student!) and made our final decisions on who would receive a scholarship this year, and how much they would receive. The interview day is long and tiring, but also very rewarding. Spending the day with these kids, feeling their energy and passion makes this one of the most rewarding days of the Kiwanis year.

This year we are awarding 22 scholarships totaling \$35,000. There are three levels, \$750, \$1250 and \$4000.
